


FOUNDER OF AKSIPS

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

At AKSIPS, we provide sound education to approximately 5000 students in our five branches. The students desirous of taking admission in Nursery, LKG and UKG are registered in the month of December. The admission is done on the basis of draw of lots or first come first basis. Admission to higher classes is done on the basis of vacancy of seats. Students coming from other schools must produce the following documents:

1. Certified copy of Transfer Certificate (For transfer cases)
2. Progress report(for transfer cases)
3. Birth Certificate(Original/attested)
4. Character Certificate(For transfer cases)
5. Last fee receipt (for transfer cases)
6. Two photographs each of the child and parents
7. Residence proof
8. Copy of Aadhar Card (Optional)

There will be upto 8%increase in Fee every year.



AFFILIATION & RECOGNITION

AKSIPS 41 Chandigarh is affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) for the All India Secondary School Examination and the All India Senior Secondary School Examination under the new pattern of 10+2. **AKSIPS 65** Mohali is affiliated to CBSE for the All India Secondary School Examination and All India Senior Secondary School Examination under the new pattern of 10+2. **AKSIPS45** Chandigarh is affiliated to CBSE for All India Secondary School Examination. **AKSIPS 125** is recognized by the Punjab Education Department. Classes in **AKSIPS 125** are from Playway to Class II. Students are automatically transferred to any branch of AKSIPS after Class II on the basis of vacancy of seats. **AKSIPS 123** is affiliated to CBSE for the All Indian Secondary School Examination.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMME (UP TO CLASS XII)

1. Three years of Pre-Primary
2. Ten years of Primary, Middle and Secondary(Class I to X)
3. Two years of Senior Secondary Education (Medical, Non-Medical, Commerce and Humanities)

REVISION SCHEDULE

CLASSES VI TO VIII

Scholastic Areas

- The session is divided into two terms (Term1 & Term2).
- Term One (Half Yearly) Revision will be done in September and Term Two at the end of the session i.e. in Feb/March 2019.
- There will be no formal exam conducted for Classes VI-VIII.

Class IX

Scholastic Areas

1. Periodic Test (PT) will be held 3 times in a year. The portion of syllabus will be cumulatively covered in periodic tests.
2. The periodic test will be of 40, 80, 40 marks respectively.
3. Best two of the three tests will be taken into consideration and their average shall be taken as the Annual marks for PT.
4. Weightage of 10 marks will be given to periodic tests.
5. The annual exam will be conducted in Feb/March of 80 marks.
6. The CBSE board has allotted 20 marks out of 100 for internal assessment of students.

The breakup of these 20 marks is as follows:-

- 10 marks weightage for Periodic Test(Best of two)
- 5 marks for notebook (to be assessed on regularity, neatness, punctuality and notebook upkeep)
- 5 marks for practicals/projects work as given below.

Languages- Speaking and Listening Skills

Mathematics-Laboratory Activities & Projects

Science- Practical Activities

Social Studies-Map and Project work

Class X

Scholastic Areas

- The Board Examination for 80 marks in each subject will cover 100% syllabus of only class X.
- There will 20 marks for Internal Assessment (IA) in all Scholastic Subjects. IA comprises of:

- Periodic Tests (PT) with weightage of 10 marks
- Notebook Submission of 5 marks
- Subject Enrichment Activities of 5marks
- Marks and Grades both will be awarded in each scholastic subject and a 9-point grading system, as followed by the Board in Class XII will be applicable.
- The portion of syllabus will be cumulatively covered in Periodic Test (PT) with reference to the announcement of date of tests by the school.
- The best of two Periodic Tests will be taken into consideration and the average of the two shall be taken as the annual marks for Periodic Assessment.
- The Pre–Board for Class X will be held in the month of January.
- The students will appear for AISSE conducted by CBSE in the month of March.

Co-Scholastic Areas (Class IX & X)

- Class IX & X will be graded in Co-Scholastic areas through the year on a 5-point grading scale (A to E)
A–Outstanding B–
Very Good C–Good
D–Fair
E–Average

The students shall be assessed on any two activities of her/his choice from each of the three areas i.e.,

- Work Education
- Art Education
- Health & Physical Education

Class XI

There will be two Unit Tests of each subject during the academic year. Besides this there will be two formal examinations in September and February.

Promotion Norms for Class XI

- All promotions will be based on CBSE norms.
- The pass percentage in each subject aggregate is 33%.
- A student failing in any one subject will have to appear for a compartment exam.
- **A student failing in more than one subject will not be promoted.**
- Passing both the theory paper and practical is mandatory as per the CBSE guidelines.
- Minimum 75% attendance is required for promotion.

Class XII

There will be one Unit Test of each subject during the academic year. Besides this, three formal examinations will be conducted based on the CBSE examination pattern. The students will appear for the AISSE conducted by the CBSE in the month of March.
